

Williamson 'advises Chissano'

LONDON/ Craig Williamson, one of Pretoria's best known spies, has been working for some time as a political adviser to Mozambique's President Joaquim Chissano, according to a former fellow agent in South Africa's security services.

It is not known if Williamson is still in the pay of the South African state.

He has for some time been involved in a company called GMR, with connections in the Seychelles.

He may not be the first erstwhile undercover operative Mozambique has used.

Eschel Rhoodie, former head of the department of information at the time of Infogate, the information scandal in the late '70s, said at the beginning of last year he had been asked by Mozambique's government to "prepare a five year programme on how to build bridges to the West".

His blueprint had been approved by Chissano. *[Own correspondent]*
