

• Two Portuguese were given stiff sentences on 18 July for their involvement in the murder in Portugal of a leading Mozambique National Resistance (MNR) rebei last vear. A court in Cascais, west of Lisbon, sentenced Alexandre Chagas to 18 years for killing Evo Fernandes and for carrying an illegal weapon. Joaquim Messias was jailed for eight-and-a-half years for acting as an accomplice. Fernandes' bulletridden body was found near Lisbon in April 1988. Chagas denied that he received orders from anyone linked to Mozambique, claiming he fired at Fernandes in self-defence.
