MAPUTO -- Assassinated South African academic. Professor Ruth First, was buried here yesterday alongside the graves of 13 African National Congress members killed in the Matola raid in Mozambique last year.

Some 3 000 mourners, among them Professor First's husband, Joe Slovo, attended the funeral, seconding to the Mozambique government news agency, AIM.

Six pall-bearers from the ANG carried the coffin which was diaped by an ANG flag.

Speakers at the funeral included the Frelimo party secretary for economic policy. Mr Marcelino Dos Santos, and the general secretary of the South African Communist Party, Mr Moses Mabhida.

"Ruth First had been assassinated by upartheid," Mr Dos Santos said.

Speakers stressed that although Professor Fiest had been a member of the Communist Party Central Commiste and a leader of the ANC she played no direct role in planning ANC actions in South Africa.

Professor First was

killed when a letter bomb addressed to her at the Centre for African Studies in Maputo, exploded last week.

President Samora Machel praised Ruth First before the funeral and at the same time replied to South African Defence Minister General Magnus Malan's claims that Mozambiqu's is accumulating sophisticated weapons.

"No sensible person could believe that an underdeveloped country like Mezambique constitutes an economic or military threat to South Africa," Mr. Muchel said.
