

Reported assembly of MiG aircraft in Mozambique The "Voice of Free Africa" - the anti-Mozambique Government radio with a Salisbury postal address - in a broadcast on 27th June (1630 gmt, in Portuguese) said that, according to information just received, MiG aircraft of Soviet make were being assembled in Nacala. Although the Nacala air base area was under the direct control of Cubans, East Germans and Russians, who did not allow admission to the public, it was known that the MiGs had been unloaded in Mozambique in crates and were now being assembled by Soviet technicians, the radio said.
