

S African Support for Mozambican Dissidents

The people of Zimbabwe and Mozambique are inaugurating a week of solidarity between their countries. Here is a commentary prepared by our news analyst Valery Torin:

The press in both Zimbabwe and Mozambique is now publishing commentaries on statements by the leaders of the two countries about the traditional friendship between these two neighbouring States. Zimbabwe and Mozambique are two countries with a very similar position regarding their legitimate struggle against the frequent attacks of the Boers of South Africa. A short while ago, it was revealed that the Boer regime in Pretoria had deployed many troops in the southern region along the Mozambique border.

South Africa is using war planes to this day to airlift units of armed bandits onto Zimbabwean soil. These armed bandits, the so-called dissidents of the Mozambique Government, were formed solely to destroy the legal Government of Mozambique.

Just a few days ago, the Prime Minister of Zimbabwe, Mr Robert Mugabe, stated that he had evidence of aggressive activities by South Africa designed to destroy the young State of Zimbabwe. The Mozambique newspaper 'Noticias' commenting on this matter, stated that South African aggression against the people of Zimbabwe and Mozambique called for the strengthening of friendship between these two countries to frustrate all the Boers' attempts. The liberation forces in southern Africa have not yet finished their work.

The liberation war against the oppressors, exploiters, and the last stronghold of apartheid must be brought to a conclusion by liberating Namibia and South Africa itself. These two countries must be under a government of the SWAPO party of Namibia and the African National Congress of South Africa. The liberation of these two countries will be of great significance to the Front Line States of Africa in ending turmoil in the southern part of the continent.
