A COMMUNIQUE issued by the Chief of Staff of the Mozambican Air Force in Maputo yesterday said: "A Mozambican aircraft landed in South African territory after being intercepted by South African aircraft."

The communique added: "The aircraft, a MiG-17 with the registration number 621 and piloted by Lieutenant Adriano Bomba, was intercepted at 9.45am yesterday, while on a training flight. "The Mozambican Air Force is investigating the cause of the affair," the communique said. It was signed by Major-General Americo Mpumo, the head of the Mozambican Air Force.

General Mphumo was a senlor Frelimo guerrilia commander during the 10-year war of independence.

According to an official source the "inner cabinet" of the Mozamblean Government was meeting in Maputo last night to consider the implications of the incident.
