

**Zambians warned about harbouring Mozambican rebels** (Text) Lusaka, 5th November: Secretary General of Zambia's ruling and only political party, Grey Zulu, yesterday warned Zambians living along the border with Mozambique against harbouring Mozambique National Resistance bandits (MNR). Over 300 Mozambicans on Tuesday [4th November] fled into Luangwa, a small fishing town in the eastern part of Zambia after fresh attacks by MNR rebels. They are well over 1,000 Mozambican refugees camped in refugee camps at Luangwa. Zulu, who is number two in the political hierarchy of the country, ordered the Zambians living along the border with Mozambique to keep all people entering Zambia from Mozambique in refugee camps to avoid harbouring those who may turn out to be enemies. Zulu, who was speaking in Chipata, a rural town bordering Malawi in eastern Zambia, said that refugees should not be kept in villages as the government had already established refugee camps for them.
