

'Help fight MNR bandits'

PEOPLE living in Chipinge district have been urged to work hand in hand with security forces in order to beat the MNR bandit menace.

Speaking at the Chipinge Heroes' Acre last week, Senator William Ndangana, warned the people that the South African backed bandits were bent on destroying the country's independence, for which thousands of people had died to achieve.

He said as Chipinge was one of the districts bordering Mozambique where the MNR bandits were operating from, there was need for people in the area to be vigilant all the time.

He cited the recent killing of two people and the injuring of several others in a landmine incident at Makoho near Chipinge, saying this was a clear warning that the enemy could strike again at any time.

Sen. Ndangana also appealed to the people to work tirelessly in order to improve the economy of the country. He said there was no room for people who wanted to be spoon-fed by Government.

At the ceremony, the remains of 54 ex-combatants which had been buried in shallow graves were reburied at the Chipinge Heroes Acre.
