"Armed bandits" surrender in Mozambique's Manica (Text) Twenty-two armed bandits have surrendered in Manica province, thus benefiting from the law on amnesty. They turned themselves in to the Mozambique Red Cross branch in Manica province. They will be guaranteed lodging and will receive clothing today, according to David Tembo, the Red Cross provincial secretary in Manica province. David Tembo also explained that the 22 criminals will be sent to their families or other places, depending on their individual wishes.
