

Firm gives \$8 600 to Zimofa fund

A LOCAL cigarette manufacturing company yesterday gave 1 736 T-shirts worth more than \$8 600 to the Zimbabwe-Mozambique Friendship Association.

The public relations manager for Rothmans of Pall Mall (Zimbabwe), Cde Lavert Banza, presented the T-shirts to the chairman of Zimofa and Deputy Minister of Labour, Manpower Planning and Social Welfare, Lt Col Clemence Gaza, at his ministerial offices in Compensation House, Harare.

Col Gaza said the donation had been made at an appropriate time because the hungry suffering Mozambicans were ill-equipped for the rainy season.

In the face of the rains, Lt Col Gaza appealed for donations of any form of shelter like tents more medicines, food and dressing because some of the people were naked, hungry and sick.

He appreciated the fact that more Zimbabweans, including disabled people, had been touched and reacted to the plight of Mozambicans, by giving whatever they could.
