Two MNR bandits surrender

MUTARE — Two MNR bandits gave themselves up to police at Ruda in the Hondo Valley last Friday.

The officer commanding Manicaland, Senior Assistant Commissioner Emilio Svaruka, said here that the two bandits were part of a group which was based at Gorongosa in Mozambique.

"Last year in March these two were instructed by their commander to come to Zimbabwe and loot and then return to Mozambique. When they were in Zimbabwe they did not carry out the instructions.

"After about six months, they went back and were detained by their commander, pending

prosecution because they had not carried out the instructions. They escaped, took their families to the camp inside Mozambique and themselves crossed into Zimbabwe where they finally surrendered to Ruda police," Cde Svaruka said.

● Fayabo Morgan Gumedede (44), alias Madabudabu, the dissident who

gave himself up to police in Harare on Monday, has said he wishes to become a civil servant so that he can play his part in national development.

He reported to the police in Kambuzuma in response to the general amnesty announced by the President last month. — Ziwa-Owa Corr.
