

Renamo To Increase Attacks Inside Zimbabwe

[Text] Harare Jan 2 SAPA—The Mozambican movement, MNR, will now attempt to concentrate its attacks inside Zimbabwe in a bid to force authorities in the country to move their troops away from the strategic transport routes inside Mozambique, the latest edition of MOZAMBIQUE FILE, a monthly publication by the domestic agency AIM, says.

ZIANA, Zimbabwe national news agency, reported AIM quoted Chanjunja Chivaca Joao, the 25-year-old MNR head of organisation and mobilisation for Europe, who recently turned himself over to the Mozambican authorities, as saying that the bandits' leadership blames the presence of Zimbabwean troops for their military failures inside Mozambique, ZIANA news agency reports.

In an interview, Joao said following a meeting of the MNR leadership in the West German town of Heidelberg last October, the "bandits" adopted a change in military strategy whose centrepiece would now be to intensify attacks inside Zimbabwe.

Joao is quoted as saying "the MNR will now attempt a significant concentration of forces inside Zimbabwe in order to force the Zimbabwean authorities to move their troops away from the strategic transport routes inside Mozambique that they are helping to defend."
