

Thirty-two armed bandits of the South African sponsored MNR handed themselves over to the Mozambican authorities in the southern province of Inhambane so far this year. The news was given by Radio Mozambique on 30 May, adding that two of the 32 bandits handed themselves over with their weapons. The December 1987 amnesty law was extended for another year after it expired on 31 December 88.

This year, too, the Mozambique armed forces (FPLM) freed some 900 people from bandit camps in Inhambane province. The radio said the figures were released by Inhambane provincial governor Pascoal Zandamela this week.
