Maputo frees British prisoner

A British businessman and an Australian missionary were among flive foreigners freed by the Mozambican authorities yesterday as part of a general pardon for all those serving prison terms for security offences, writes Paul Fauvet in Maputo.

The Briton, Mr Finiay Hamilton, was given a 20-year sentence in 1983 for illegal possession of arms. The Australian, Mr Ian Grey, a member of the obscure rightwing Pentecostal sect, Shekinah ministries, concessed to working for the Mozambique National Resistance.
