Town retaken from MNR

H. 9/5/92 MAPUTO. THE general staff of the Mozambican armed forces announced on Wednesday that Mozambican troops have retaken the small town of Imala, in the northern province of Nampula, which had been occupied by the MNR bandits since January 23.

The statement from the general staff Press office said that Imala was retaken on, April 24. Three bandits were killed. The general staff also said that troops killed two bandits in a clash at Mura, in Erati District, also in Nampula. It did not give the exact date of this incident.

Radio Mozambique reported yesterday that the MNR killed three people in an attack on Monday against the village of Nhacafula, in Tambara District, in the central province of Manica. The raiders abducted 11 people and burnt down 10 homes. — Ziana-Pana,
