

Landmine blast: 6 SADF men hurt

SIX SA Defence Force soldiers were flown to Pretoria yesterday after they were injured in a landmine blast near the Mozambique border.

A Bureau for Information spokesman said the men were injured when the military vehicle in which they were travelling detonated a landmine at about 8 am, on a dirt road near Nbuzine in KaNgwane, close to the Mozambique border.

The men were flown to 1 Military Hospital at Voortrekkerhoogte.

Full details of their injuries have not been released and their names would be released as soon as next of kin were notified, he said.

The type and origin of the landmine used in the attack is still being investigated.

It is believed the mine was planted by African National Congress terrorists and was probably of Soviet origin.
