Pik Botha Urges Peace Plan for Mozambique

[Text] South Africa has proposed to the United States that a peace process similar to that in Angola be set in motion for Mozambique. Foreign Minister Pik Botha says he made the suggestion in December to then U.S. Secretary of State George Shultz. He says he has not yet had any feedback from the new Bush administration about his idea. He says the acceptance of the idea will depend on the agreement of the Mozambican government, but he believed Maputo will be amenable to the idea. An issue of major concern to both South Africa and Mozambique is the plan to reactivate South Africa's biggest hydro-electric project at Cahora Bassa in Mozambique. The two countries signed a nonaggression pact, the Nkomati Accord in 1984, but relations have been mostly strained since then.
