

# Mozambique mediation going well — Moi

NAIROBI.

ZIMBABWE'S and Kenya's mediation efforts to end the strife in Mozambique are progressing well, according to Kenyan President Daniel arap Moi.

The Kenyan media has quoted President Moi as telling his countrymen in London, where he is on an official visit, that he and President Mugabe were "moving steadily with the Mozambique peace initiative and positive progress has

been made". H. 25/11/89

President Mugabe and President Moi were asked by Mozambique in June to mediate and help work out a peace initiative.

The Mozambican government, through the church leaders, have been trying to persuade the MNR bandits to end their armed banditry and join in the development of the country.

The Mozambican government

has drawn up a peace proposal document. MNR countered this by issuing its own proposals, which the ruling Frelimo party has dismissed as "nonsense".

Meanwhile, people living in the district of Sussundenga, in the central Mozambican province of Manica, told President Joaquim Chissano on Thursday that they rejected any power sharing between the Frelimo party and the MNR bandits. — Ziana-AIM.
