MNR want talks in Hairobi

NAIROBI.

THE MNR bandits have said they were ready to begin unconditional peace talks with the Maputo government, but insisted on meeting in the Kenyan capital of Nairobi.

The bandits have been fighting Mozambique's government since shortly after independence from Portugal in 1975.

Nairobi was the venue for preliminary contacts last year between the bandits and church leaders representing the government.

Mozambican President Cde Joaquim Chissano has suggested that fullscale peace talks be held in Zimbabwe. — Ziana-Reuter.
