Some 5,000 Zimbabwean troops start withdrawing (ME/1518 B/3 -Text) About 5,000 Zimbabwean troops have begun withdrawing from Mozambique. The soldiers were first sent there a decade ago to act in support of the Frelimo [Mozambique Liberation Frontl government against the MNR [Mozambique National Resistancel rebels. Zimbabwe's Defence Minister, Moven Mahachi, says the pull-out should be complete by the middle of next month. The withdrawal follows the peace agreement signed between the Mozambican government and the MNR in Rome at the beginning of this month.
