

UN military plan for *Arg.* Mozambique

NEW YORK. — United Nations Secretary-General Mr Boutros Boutros-Ghali has proposed a big military and civilian operation for Mozambique in preparation for multiparty elections.

Affirming that “an end is at last in sight to the cruel war” that ravaged the nation for 14 years, he recommended that the Security Council approve “very substantial resources” to aid in reconciliation.

“This reflects my conviction that it will not be possible in Mozambique to create the conditions for a successful election unless the military situation has been brought fully under control,” he said.

“If the United Nations is to undertake the responsibilities entrusted to it by the Mozambicans, what has to be done must be done well, and quickly.”

He also acknowledged that there was a risk involved for the international community, but added that it was worth taking.
