## Moz leaders agree to one administration

MAPUTO. — President Joaquim Chissano of Mozambique and former rebei leader Mr Afonso Dhlakama have agreed in principle to unite the country under a single administration in preparation for elections planned for next year.

They will resume talks today to try to overcome other obstacles still in the way of a comprehensive agreement charting the transition to multi-party

democracy.

Mr Chissano told reporters on Saturday night that both the government and the former rebel movement Renamo agreed there should be a single administration before the elections.

Mr Dhiakama said Renamo was no longer demanding five new provincial governors, but wanted guarantees that the local authorities would be im-

partial.
"Everyone was prepared to listen." Mr Chissano said after talks involving 11 provincial governors and Mr Dhlakama's provincial representatives.—
