

Moz talks breakthrough

MAPUTO. — Mozambican President Joaquim Chissano and former Renamo rebel leader Mr Afonso Dhlakama agreed yesterday on two contentious issues stalling Mozambique's peace process.

But Mr Dhlakama said he would not send his ex-guerillas to assembly points to be merged with government forces in a new national army until the latest agreements were implemented.

Under yesterday's deal, the govern-

ment will appoint three Renamo members as advisers to each of Mozambique's 11 provincial governors.

The second issue on which agreement was reached concerned the policing of the country until multi-party elections next year October.

Mr Chissano said the government would ask the UN to send police to monitor the activities of the national police force and to help in training. —
