

Renamo threatened with eviction

MAPUTO. — About 150 Renamo officials have been threatened with eviction from Maputo's Cardoso Hotel for not paying their bills.

The Renamo members have been staying at the Cardoso, owned by Lonrho and rated one of the best hotel in the Mozambican capital, since 1992.

They were admitted to the hotel by Lonrho boss Tiny Rowland when a shortage of accommodation in Maputo for Renamo representatives coming in from the bush threat-

ened to disrupt the peace process.

Mr Rowland had part of the hotel cleared of other guests to accommodate the former guerrillas and they have been there ever since.

According to Raul Domingos, Renamo's representative on the supervisory and control commission, the Cardoso bills should be paid by the United Nations operation in Mozambique, Onumoz.

UN special representative Aldo Ajello has arranged a meeting with Lonrho representative John Heuelet to discuss the matter.
