6 executed

MAPUTO. — Six men sentenced to death by Mozambique's revolutionary military tribunal were executed by firing squad in public yesterday.

They included a Maputo businessman, Goolam Naby, who was convicted of smuggling large quantities of prawns out of the country and depositing the earnings in foreign bank accounts.

Others were found guilty of murdering a Greek bakery owner, of belonging to the rebel 'South African-backed Mozambique National Resistance and taking part in the murder of civilians and the burning of schools and hospitals. — Sapa-Reuter.
