

Dissension reported in ranks of MNR: attack on Beira The Mozambique National Resistance movement (MNR) has confirmed the existence of dissension within its ranks, according to Capital Radio, Umtata, on 19th December. The radio cited MNR guerrilla leader Afonso Dhlakama as having accused a senior MNR guerrilla commander of divisiveness and of stripping Evo Fernandez, until July Secretary General of the MNR, of all representative functions. Another MNR spokesman, George Correia, was also reported stripped of all his posts. The same radio also reported that the MNR had claimed that it had carried out a damaging attack against the Mozambican port of Beira. Military installations were claimed to have been destroyed and 39 government troops killed. In another attack claimed by the movement, a train was said to have been attacked and 41 Mozambican and 19 Zimbabwean troops killed.
